How Do We Get There?

Kaiwaka is conveniently situated on the SH1 about 1½ to 2 hours north of Auckland.

Air - to Auckland or Whangarei

Auckland Airport is south of the city which necessitates tackling Auckland traffic .

Whangarei Airport requires an extra, but picturesque, plane ride and you are then just over an hour away from Kaiwaka going in the right direction for the traffic.

Bus – The Intercity bus goes through Kaiwaka.

Car – Cars can be hired from Auckland and Whangarei airports.

Nearer the time if we know the timetables of your flights we may be able to organise shared transport to Kaiwaka

The Leisurely Approach

Come to visit our diverse and beautiful area. Kaiwaka is centrally placed for a wealth of local attractions. Within an hour you can visit Whangarei, Waipu, Mangawhai, Warkworth and Matakoho and their attractions. Bring family or friends and come for longer!!

You can visit the fascinating **museums** around. **Waipu** has a Scottish and Nova Scotian heritage; **Mangawhai** is a local village venue; **Matakoho** hosts the renowned **Kauri Museum**; **Whangarei** hosts the **Hundertwasser museum** in all it's colourful glory.

Beaches in the area are some of the most beautiful New Zealand has to offer. **Ruakaka, Waipu Cove, Langs Beach** and Mangawhai are second to none, the latter offering great surfing to watch or to do. The others are long sandy and pretty safe beaches. There are fishing charters available at Mangawhai as well.

Walks – There are some great walks around the area, both coastal and forest and a local waterhole complete with waterfall at the picturesque Piroa Falls.

Waipu Caves are free to go into but the **Waipu Caves Farm Park** run **guided informative trips**. The caves are now easily accessible.

The Cheese Shop in Kaiwaka has beautiful cheeses and Dutch specialities

The Chocolate Factory in Mangawhai is a must!

The Kaiwaka Area has a lot of Northern hospitality to offer. Make the time to investigate

Saturday Dance'n Dinner



The programme for this dance has not been published yet. However, we will be dancing a very special dance which commemorates the death of one of our founder members Anne Duthie who slipped away from us

Lullaby for Anne a 3x32 bar strathspey.

- 1 – 4 1st couple advance for 1 bar and touch right hands, then retire for 1bar and cross over left hand to opposite side.
- 5 - 8 1st couple repeat to own sides
- 9 -16 All cples dance an 8 bar reflection reel, 1st cple dancing in and down
- 17-20 1st cple cross over right hand and cast into 2nd place. 2nd cple move up (bars 19 & 20).
- 21-24 1st cple meet in the centre, dance down between the 3rd couple to beyond 3rd place and curl back into it on opposite sides. 3rd couple move up on bars 21 and 22.
- 25-32 1st cple petronella turn, set ;petronella to own sides and set, while 2nd and 3rd cples set to ptrns , dance four hands round to the left ,then set together with 1st couple.

Enter into the spirit of the night. Dress up in the style of a country of your choice, bring an item, poem, song, music or dance for a wonderful shared experience.
